Faith-based Social Assistance Establishments for the Elderly: Global Experience and Reality in Vietnam

Abstract: Regarding the participation of religious organizations in the provision of social services, many studies have shown that these organizations are actively involved in the welfare system as important social service providers in many Western countries. In Vietnam, facing rapid aging of the population and limited public resources, the State has introduced a number of new social policies to mobilize religious organizations to provide care services for target groups of social protection, including the elderly. This article aims to understand the role of religious organizations in providing social services for the elderly in the world, and analyzes the overall picture

of the process of formation and development as well as some characteristics of faith-based social assistance establishments for the elderly in Vietnam. The challenges of these institutions' operations pose the requirement of improving the legal basis for them and suggest further research on the development prospects of this model. The data of this article is from website content analysis, secondary document analysis and fieldwork at six Buddhist and Catholic social assistance establishments for the elderly.

Social Work Services in Hospitals in Response to Patient Demands in National and Local Hospitals Today

Abstract: Since 2011, based on the project "Development of social work as a profession in Health sector in 2011-2020" according to Decision 2514/QĐ-BYT of the Ministry of Health dated July 15, 2011, the Ministry of Health has deployed some social work models in hospitals. The project aimed to comprehensively support the healthcare process, support disadvantaged groups to effectively access healthcare services in certain hospitals' conditions, and improve patient-medical staff relationships. The development of these social work models has created concrete effects in reducing the pressure for medical staff and helping patients, especially disadvantaged groups in

accessing social resource systems during hospitalisation. That 10 years of development has raised a question about the level of satisfaction of patients with social work models deployed in hospitals. This paper partly answers the question by comparing social work services being provided in hospitals with the above-mentioned project's objectives/expectations and analysing the level of satisfaction via the assessment of both providers and beneficiary groups of social work service in hospitals.

The Status of Vocational Training and Job Seeking Support for Ethnic Minority Youth with Disabilities in Hoa Binh Province

Abstract: This paper presents the results of research on the current situation of vocational training and employment support policies for ethnic minorities with disabilities in Hoa Binh province. The study used a mix method of quantitative and qualitative data collection strategies with 151 ethnic minority disabled young people and 27 staff in the local support network. The results show that ethnic minority youth with disabilities were facing many challenges that limited their participation in training and job-seeking. The study also

identified the key social determinants based on the ecosystem model that affect their status quo, including ethnic minority youth with disabilities's limited awareness, challenges from their families support, staff members, and the community, as well as the shortage of supporting programs and policies in vocational training and job placement, especially in the locality. The research suggests social assistance activities and ways to enhance the effectiveness of vocational training policies towards creating favorable conditions for ethnic minority

youth with disabilities to get access and effectively utilise policies on education, training and employment. This ensures their smooth social integration and ensures that they are not be left behind.

Some Self-care Activities of Middle-aged Women

Abstract: This article focuses on analyzing some self-care activities of middle-aged women. The questionnaire survey was conducted on 512 participants aged 40-60 years old in Hanoi city and Quang Ninh province. The results show that middle-aged women show effort to control their physical health index at an average level ($M = 3,03$, $SD = 0,91$) with proactive measures to monitor weight monitor their weight, height, and body measurements and they try to have a balanced diet. Most middle-aged women choose to go for a health check only when they have an illness (45,9%). They often recognize signs of illness by relying on their own knowledge

(55,3%). When suffering from physical illness, middle-aged women choose the most common solution if going to the pharmacy to consult. When they have mental health problems, they choose to share with family members, friends, colleagues and find ways to solve them themselves. In addition, the research results also show that women in urban areas have a higher level of health care practice than women in rural areas. It is worth noting that psychological counseling and social work services are the less chosen solutions.
